## **ARC Tutor Expectations**

Tutoring is both an honor and a responsibility and, although no Hippocratic Oath exists such as doctors take when entering the medical profession, your role as a peer tutor does include agreed upon practices and ethical guidelines, such as the following:

- 1. To help students gain confidence in themselves and to promote their independent learning
- 2. To respect students, including their ability levels, cultural differences, and learning styles
- 3. To arrive punctually for all appointments and work shifts, both as a courtesy and as an example
- 4. To maintain confidentiality at all times with information students share: grades, personal problems, classroom observations
- 5. To refrain from criticism or editorializing about ODU faculty and staff
- 6. To honesty when you do not know an answer, and a commitment to work with your tutee to find answers
- 7. To greet and to welcome any ODU student who comes to you for assistance
- 8. To do your best every time to assist students
- 9. To communicate with your supervisor when job-related concerns surface
- $10. \ \ To\ maintain\ accurate\ records\ and\ to\ document\ your\ sessions\ and\ schedules\ in\ Tutor Trac$
- 11. To continue to improve your own proficiency in your subject area by attending all training sessions and meetings
- 12. To inform students as appropriate about other campus resources
- 13. To remain in your work place during all scheduled hours (unless you need to use the "five minutes away" alternative)
- 14. To refrain from eating and loud socializing in your work place
- 15. To maintain a professional relationship with your tutees
- 16. To dress in an appropriate manner
