Program Overview

ODU and Mount Carmel College of Nursing have developed jointly a Pre-Nursing program where a limited number of eligible ODU students will be accepted annually into the Mount Carmel program.

Students complete their general education classes at ODU and can live on our campus and then complete their final five semesters of nursing courses on the campus of Mount Carmel College of Nursing. Those students who successfully complete the nursing requirements will be awarded a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Mount Carmel.

Why ODU?

- We provide one-on-one student/faculty interaction. Students will get to know their professors due to smaller class sizes. This enables students to use faculty as resources to further succeed in their courses.
- Our science building, Battelle Hall, houses the majority of Pre-Nursing courses and provides state-of-the-art facilities and equipment.

Internships & Research

- Students will have the opportunity to become involved in several aspects of the ODU campus and community, including the Wellness Center and Mohun Hall.
- Pre-Nursing students also will have the unique opportunity to become involved in research while at ODU. This can range from independent research with fellow faculty to in-class research, looking at current issues in science.

Career Possibilities

Pre-Nursing majors are prepared for a career as a registered nurse, as well as a wide range of other fields including: graduate school, hospital technician, research, physical/occupational therapy graduate school, medical school, rehabilitation, among others.

On-Campus Opportunities
