

## FINES

1. Public Safety officers issue citations, which include the date, time, location and violation type.
2. Fines range from \$35 to \$75, depending on the violation. Fines are added to the student account and billed monthly. All fines must be paid in full in order to register for classes, graduate or receive transcripts. Staff and faculty fines are deducted from their paycheck.
3. If you allow anyone to borrow your car or permit, you are responsible for any tickets and fines they incur.

## CITATION APPEALS

1. A citation may be appealed to the director of Public Safety if the recipient feels the citation was unjustified.
2. Appeals must be made within 15 days of receiving the ticket. Appeals can be made in person or online. Appeal forms are located in the Public Safety office. To access the online appeal form, go to [ohiodominican.edu/Public\\_Safety](http://ohiodominican.edu/Public_Safety). Then select Appeal Form, which appears under Popular Links on the right side menu.
3. Public Safety will send a copy of the appeal decision to the appellant via ODU email. The director's decision is final.

## TOWING POLICY

1. ODU's campus is a private, tow-away zone. Towing of cars is authorized by Ohio Revised Code 4511.681.
2. Public Safety may tow vehicles for illegal parking, as stated in the Parking and Traffic Regulations section. Vehicles with excessive fines may also be towed.
3. Towing charges are determined by and payable in cash to the towing service at the time of retrieval.
4. In lieu of towing, a wheel-locking device may be used. To have the apparatus removed, contact Public Safety.

1. ODU disclaims all responsibility for loss or damage to vehicles parked on ODU property. ODU is not responsible for loss or damage to any vehicle towed from campus, or in which a wheel-locking device has been used.

# Parking and Traffic Regulations

Welcome to Ohio Dominican University. We hope you enjoy your time on campus. This brochure provides information on our parking permits and regulations. ## Registration and Fees

1. All motor vehicles parked on campus must be registered with Ohio Dominican University's Department of Public Safety. To purchase a permit, students must have an ODU identification card, and vehicle license number and description. Purchase parking permits online at [ohiodominican.edu/Parking](http://ohiodominican.edu/Parking). The student's account will be billed.
2. Refunds may be issued until 30 business days after the start of the semester. Summer term permits are nonrefundable.
  - a. Fall term only: \$60
  - b. Spring term only: \$60
  - c. Summer term only: \$20
  - d. Full academic year: \$100

## Parking Permit Display Location


1. Hang the parking permit from the rearview mirror facing out so that all information is clearly visible.

## Temporary Permits

1. Temporary permits are available for those who need to park an unregistered vehicle on campus. They may also be issued for special needs such as temporary disabilities. The Department of Public Safety provides temporary permits at no cost. They are valid for up to two weeks after which students must purchase a regular parking permit.
2. Visitors who park a vehicle on campus must register with the Department of Public Safety and receive a visitor permit. At no time are ODU students considered visitors.

## Replacement Permits

1. Lost or stolen permits must be reported to the Department of Public Safety and are replaced at the vehicle owner's expense.
2. Students may purchase replacement permits from ODU's website at the full permit price. Replaced permits are invalidated to prevent unauthorized use.

## Student Parking

1. Students may park in the Gold Lot behind Alumni Hall/student center and in the student section of the White Lot east of ODU's football stadium, Panther Stadium. Student permits cannot be purchased for use by any person other than the student who registered the vehicle. All parking behind Erskine Hall is reserved for Presidential and visitor use only.
2. The Black Lot, located near the residence halls, is restricted by special permission only. Any vehicle parked there without the proper special permit will be ticketed and could be towed.

## Parking and Traffic Regulations

1. Anyone parking in a handicapped parking space must have a state-issued handicapped license plate or plaque in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 4511.69. Violators will be cited and towed at the owner's expense. Violators also are subject to citation by the Columbus Police.
2. There is no student parking at any time for any reason on the east side of campus (behind the academic buildings). Students will be ticketed and fined, and may be towed.

3. Any vehicle parked in a fire lane will be cited and towed at the owner's expense.
4. Parking is prohibited in areas not marked as parking spaces. This includes loading zones, sidewalks, crosswalks, building entrances, construction zones, grass and areas in parking lots not marked as spaces.
5. All vehicles must be parked in areas designated by their parking permits. All vehicles must be operable; inoperable vehicles cannot be stored on campus.
6. The speed limit on campus is 15 mph. Campus roads are also walkways and pedestrians have the right-of-way.

## Misuse of Permit

1. All parking permits are the property of ODU and must be returned upon request.
2. Parking permits are nontransferable. Any registrant who gives, sells, alters, lends or transfers a permit to another will forfeit their campus parking rights and be liable for all citations issued to that permit.
